

The run will start and finish at the Museum of Power at Langford, near Maldon leaving at 9.30 sharp. There is ample parking for vans and cars and trailers. EFA members on suitable trail bikes will be more than welcome, all we ask in the interest of maintaining a decent image with other byway users is that there are no modern enduro machines. We use the 'end over end' system - which will be explained at the start - so every individual can go at their own pace.

Then on Sunday April 17 - Essex Bluebell Run. Again starting from the Museum of Power from 9.30 this is an event for over 25 year old road machines. The route, which will be by a route card, will be 90 miles with a mid-morning coffee stop and a lunch stop. On the route will be a number of treasure hunt style clues to solve, a number of checkpoints with motorcycling questions and the option of riding 'road bike friendly' byways to gain extra bonus points. Being mildly competitive there are a few awards up for grabs. Again, EFA members will be more than welcome, although I do realise that this unfortunately clashes with the Roger Birch trial. Every year I try my best to avoid this clash but once again, despite my best efforts it's happened again!

However, if you fancy doing something a little different, please come along. The byways run is just a matter of turning up in good time; the Bluebell Run is a bit more formal and will involve an entry form and a fee of £5, plus £3 day membership for anyone who is not a VMCC member. The last action also included people! When Spud greeted you as a friend he would wag his tail and then circle around you. 


